The City has received a request from Wendy Fisher, Utah Open Lands, that City Council execute a Regional Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP) partnership commitment letter for the Lundin and Heart of Midway properties to use in its application for RCPP funding for these properties.

BACKGROUND:

At the Midway Open Space Committee Meeting held June 5, 2024, Wendy Fisher provided an update on RCPP funding (1.5 billion authorized by Congress in past year). The North Fields has been designated as a "Grasslands of special significance". Utah Open Lands is seeking to expand this designation to include the Lundin property and Heart of Midway properties off Center Street and apply for RCPP funding for these properties. Applications are due the end of June. Since Midway has committed bond money toward both projects, Utah Open Lands is seeking a partnership commitment letter from Midway to include with the RCPP application.

At the June 5, 2024, meeting, the Open Space Committee made the following motion and recommendation:

Motion by Woody Woodruff to recommend that City Council execute a RCPP partnership commitment letter (for Lundin and Heart of Midway properties) to be used by Utah Open Lands in its application for RCPP funding.

Seconded by Steve Stevens. All present voted in favor of the motion.
